Just as any other State in Nigeria, Gombe State Government generate its revenue and receive funds from the Federal Government monthly. Revenue accrued to the Federal Government of Nigeria from various sources (crude oil sales, revenue from other mineral resources, Company income tax, Collections by Federal Inland Revenue Service, Nigeria Customs and Value Added Tax - VAT etc. are allocated based on agreed sharing formula among the 3 tiers (Federal, State and Local Governments).

However, the revised budget consist of the sum of Fifty-Six Billion, Nine Hundred and Fifty-Six Million, Six Hundred and Nine Thousand, Four Hundred and Ninety-Three (N56,956,609,493.48) Naira, Fourty-Eight Kobo for Capital Expenditure with MDAs sharing as in the table adjacent.
